
Let us Pray:

Our reading/story today is taken from Matthew John 12:12-19 (https://youtu.be/z-39h0xYqdE):

JESUS RIDES A DONKEY

As Jesus came closer to Jerusalem, he asked two of his disciples to go ahead of Him. He said, "When you get to the town, you will see a donkey tied up. Untie it, and bring it to me. If anyone asks you about taking the donkey, just tell them, 'The Lord needs it and He will bring it back as soon as He's done with it."

So, the disciples did as Jesus asked. They soon found the donkey tied at a doorway. As they were untying it, some people were standing nearby visiting. They didn't recognize the men and asked, "What are you doing? Why are you untying the donkey?"

They replied just as Jesus had told them to. Explaining that the Lord needed it, the people let them go.

They brought the donkey to Jesus and Jesus rode on the donkey towards Jerusalem.

As He was traveling, some people saw Jesus coming and came running towards Him. They had heard He might be coming. One by one, they laid their coats on the ground for the donkey to step on. People cut palm branches and laid them down.



As they got even closer to the town, more and more

people noticed Jesus. A crowd surrounded Him and started to shout praises to Him for all the miracles He had done: "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna, Hosanna!" .

Some men named Pharisees (these men thought they were important; a lot of the people listened to them). They heard the crowd praising God. They said to Jesus, "Teacher, why don't you tell these people to stop praising you as if you were God?"

Jesus replied, "If they were quiet now, even the rocks would cry out!"

Today is palm Sunday. The day that all those years ago, Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey and the crowds cheered, laying down their coats and waving palm leaves.

One part of this reading that always makes me think is when Jesus says: "If they were quiet now, even the rocks would cry out!"

What might the rocks have said if they did cry out? Maybe they would have told us about how David used a small stone to slay a giant to show that we can d anything when God is with us!

Another might remind us that Jesus once told a story about a wise man who built his house upon a rock. When the storm came the house on the rock stood firm.

Yes, there are many stories that the rocks could tell, be we won't let them. Just as the followers of Jesus lined the streets to praise their King, we can praise him to. As long as we praise Him, there will be no need for these stones to cry out.
