
Let us Pray:

Today is FATHERS DAY. We are so lucky that we all share the greatest Father there ever was GOD the FATHER. Dads give us rules to follow to ensure we are safe just like God who has given us rules since the beginning of time.

Last week we were left in the Garden of Eden with its two trees in the center, the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Following this God saw that Adam was alone and created him a partner from his rib. Adam must have explained the rule of not eating from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil because as the serpent (snake) asked she knew the rule, however she chose not to follow the rule.

Sweets are not good for you and will surely make you fat and give you cavities in your teeth.

I'm sure that you probably know that the surest way to get someone to do something is to tell them they can't do it. It has been that way since the beginning of time.

In the beginning, after God had created everything, He placed Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden to take care of it. He said to them, "You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will surely die."

The serpent was very clever, more clever than any of the animals that God had made. He slithered up to Eve one day and said to her, "I understand that God told you that you could eat from any tree in the garden. Is that true?"

"No, not all of the trees," Eve replied. "We can eat from all of the trees except the one in the middle of the garden. God told us that if we ate from that tree, we would die."
