Only, O Lord, in thy dear love Fit us for perfect rest above; And help us this and every day To live more nearly as we pray.






We are in the presence of God.

Our reading today is Genesis 45: https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Genesis%2045&version=NIV

Today we are remembering those who gave their lives so we can enjoy our freedoms. As we come to the end of the book of Genesis, we see a time when this great family had the opportunity to remember and share experiences, but this was after many bad things had happened and at a time when Joseph could have been resentful and not forgiven.

Remember Joseph had had his multi coloured coat ripped off him and thrown in a pit. He had been sold into slavery. He was lied about. He was thrown in jail. He had interpreted dreams and put in charge in a very senior position to oversee the management of the famine.

In todays reading we see that Joseph had a choice. He could choose to punish his brothers for what they had done to him, or he could forgive them and reunite with them. Joseph chose forgiveness, and God wants us to forgive others, too.

There are times when someone has done something nasty to us and we've been angry at them. Those times hurt us, but we have to make a choice whether we forgive or not.

We are going to try an experiment. Get a lemon and cut it in half. Now take a bite of one half of the lemon.


What did that taste like? - Bitter? Sour? Horrible?

Now squeeze the other half the lemon into a cup and add sugar. Mix it together. Now how does that taste? Sweet? Pleasant? Nice?

The first lemon was bitter like the bitterness we feel when we don't forgive. The second lemon was sweet and tasty like the sweetness we feel when we forgive others.



God chooses to forgive us when we ask, and Joseph forgave his brothers for the horrible things they did. God wants us to follow Joseph's example of sweet forgiveness and forgive others.
