You might have read in the local paper the Sheppey Community Development Forum have been busy planning for a Community Bus which will provide a mobile mini-supermarket together with help and advice from specialist groups. The mini- supermarket will supply fresh food where possible as well as the usual tins and packets which are normal for food banks. The double decker bus has been donated to us by Travelmasters who will also help with servicing and garaging. At the moment the bus is away being kitted out to make a shop on the lowere deck and meeting rooms on the top deck.

The bus is seen as a route out of dependency, to encourage those who have been relying on the food banks, to independence. Those who want to use the service provided will pay a monthly subscription, thus restoring their self respect. The bus will be able to reach almost every point on the Island but the initial priority will be to reach those areas of Sheppey which are furthest from Sheerness. The plan is to start the service in September and gradually increase to cover all areas of Sheppey.
