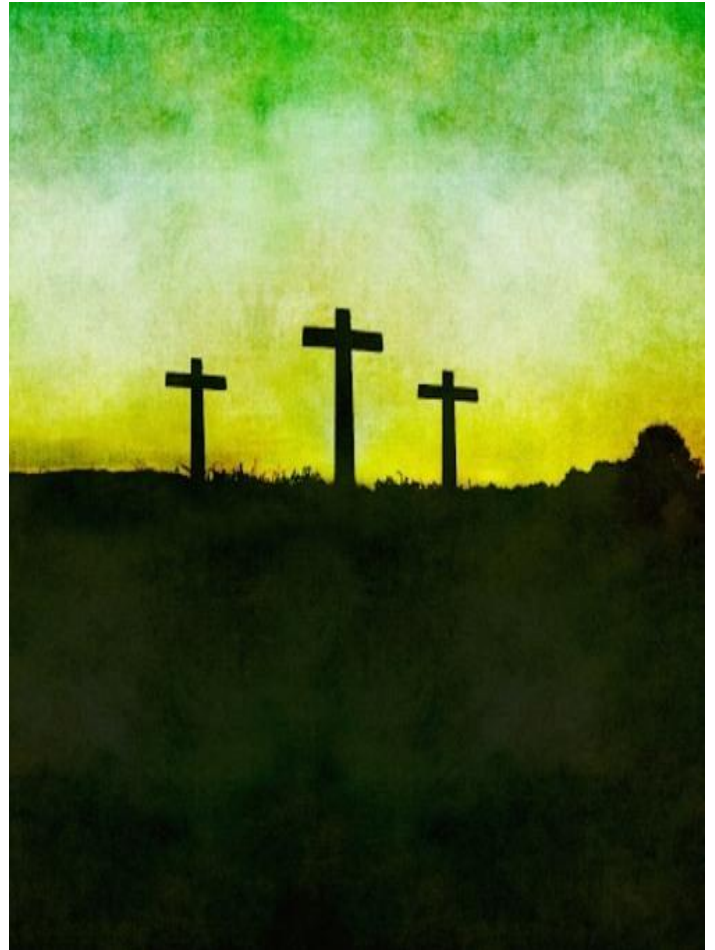

## **Good morning and welcome to Our Good Friday message.**

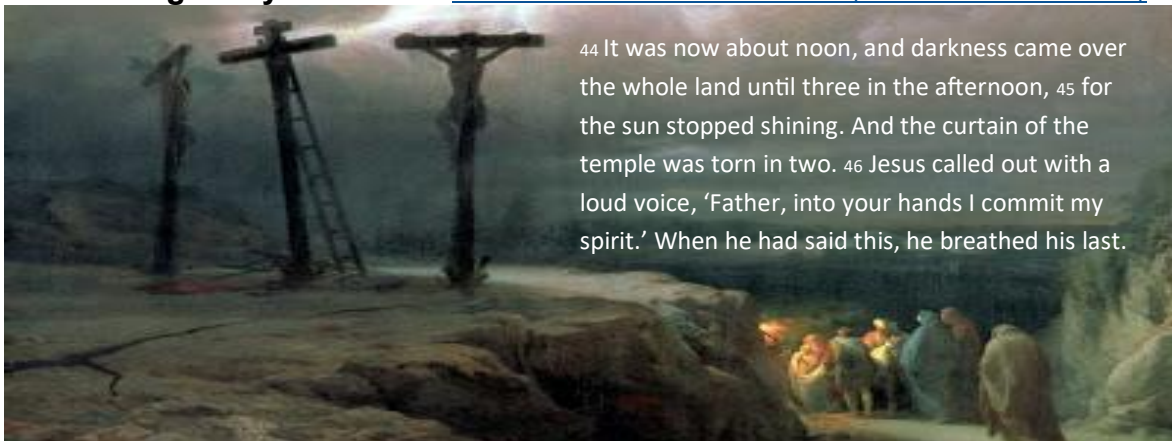
**Our first hymn for today is: "There is a Green Hill Far Away"**

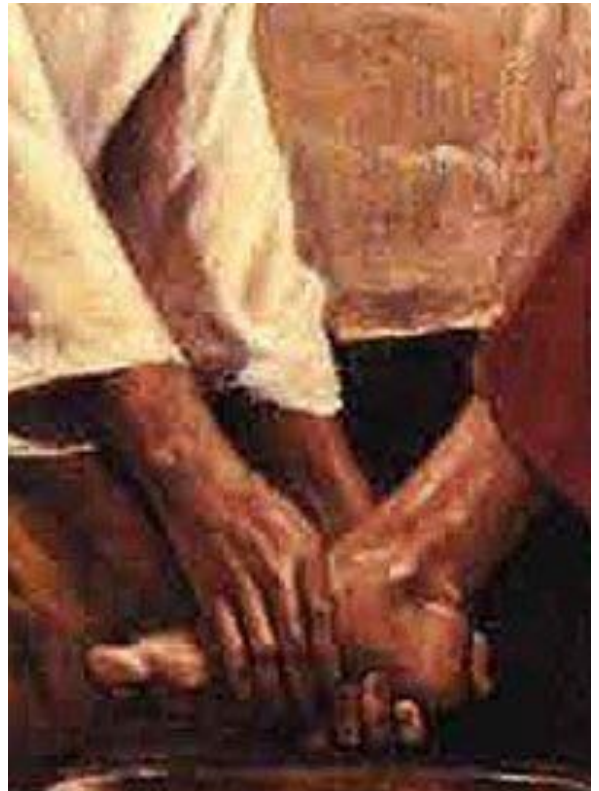
From heaven you came helpless babe

## Why is Good Friday Good?

One year on and all remains strange not knowing what to expect, hopes raised and dashed really strange times but no stranger than that first Good Friday.

Good Friday is sort of a strange name for such a sad day. On Good Friday, we remember the day that Jesus was nailed to a cross and hung up to die with two criminals on either side of him. It was a very sad day. His disciples were heart-broken and his mother and other friends stood at the foot of the cross weeping. They could not believe that their wonderful teacher, friend, son was dying in front of their very eyes.

The man that had led them for the past few years, taught them new things about forgiveness and love was dying on a cross, and we call it GOOD Friday! How could such a sad day be called good?

Many years ago we had a French exchange student, Eric, staying with us over Easter. I remember him asking my mum why we called Good Friday good? I think I agreed with the question. In my mind the cross represented a very bad thing that happened. However, the cross is the symbol that is recognised the world over as something unique to Christianity. When you see a cross on a building you can know that the building has or had something to with the Christian Church – a place of worship, a school, or a hospital. Children at a very young age know in their own child-like way what the cross stands for. Its message is simple - Jesus died on a cross.

What's so amazing about this unique Christian symbol is that it represents an instrument of torture and death. The Romans used the cross to punish criminals and those who rebelled against Roman authority. It was cruel and barbaric. Nails were driven through hands and feet of the victim. The cross then raised. The victims gasped as they tried to get air into their lungs. They could hang there for days, in excruciating pain, until they died.

If that is the case, why do we display the cross so prominently in our churches, wear crosses around our necks, on our lapels or on earrings. Why is it that we allow our children to make crosses – one of the cruellest forms of torture and execution that humanity has created?

When you think about it, to hold an instrument of death with such reverence is a bit strange. Its like hanging a gallows around your neck, to remind us that this is what the cross really is – a device used to kill people – to execute criminals.

Lot's of people died on crosses, some of them murderers and the worst kind of characters imaginable who some may say deserved to be executed.

So really it should be bad Friday. Why is the cross the central symbol of our Christian faith? If the cross is so awful why wear crosses, make crosses, display crosses in our churches?

But sometimes, when we think something is bad, it is only because we don't see the whole picture... we don't know everything about the situation.

It reminds me of an old Chinese folktale where an old man's only horse, a mare, runs away. "That's bad," say his neighbours. "No, that was good," says the old man when the horse returns with a stallion by her side, and now he has two horses. "Ah, that's good," say the neighbours. "No, that was bad," says the old man after the horse throws his only son to the ground and the son breaks his hip. "That is really bad," say the neighbours. But then an army marches through the town, forcing all of the young men and sons who are healthy to go to war with them. The old man's son is not taken because of his broken hip and so he is left behind. The son heals and is able to stay and care for his old father. So the final result for this family is good.

The cross reminds us of the beginning of the whole picture. A picture where one particular person who was completely innocent and didn't deserve such a cruel death was hung - the cross reminds us of the death of Jesus of Nazareth.

Good Friday is good because of the whole picture. Jesus knew what was going to happen. He knew that he would die on the cross; but he also knew that death was not the end of the story. Jesus knew that God is more powerful than death. Jesus knew that after three days, he would rise from the dead and break the power of sin and death forever. Good Friday begins a story that ends in victory and that is why Good Friday is, indeed, good.



## Our final hymn for this Good Friday is “The Old Rugged Cross”

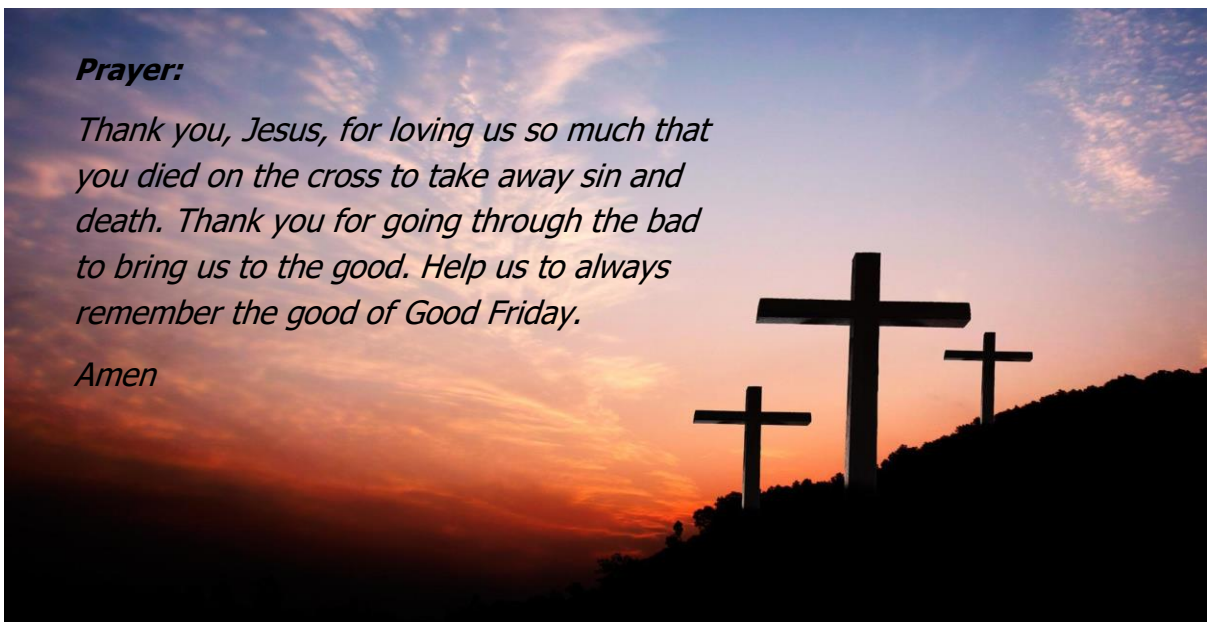

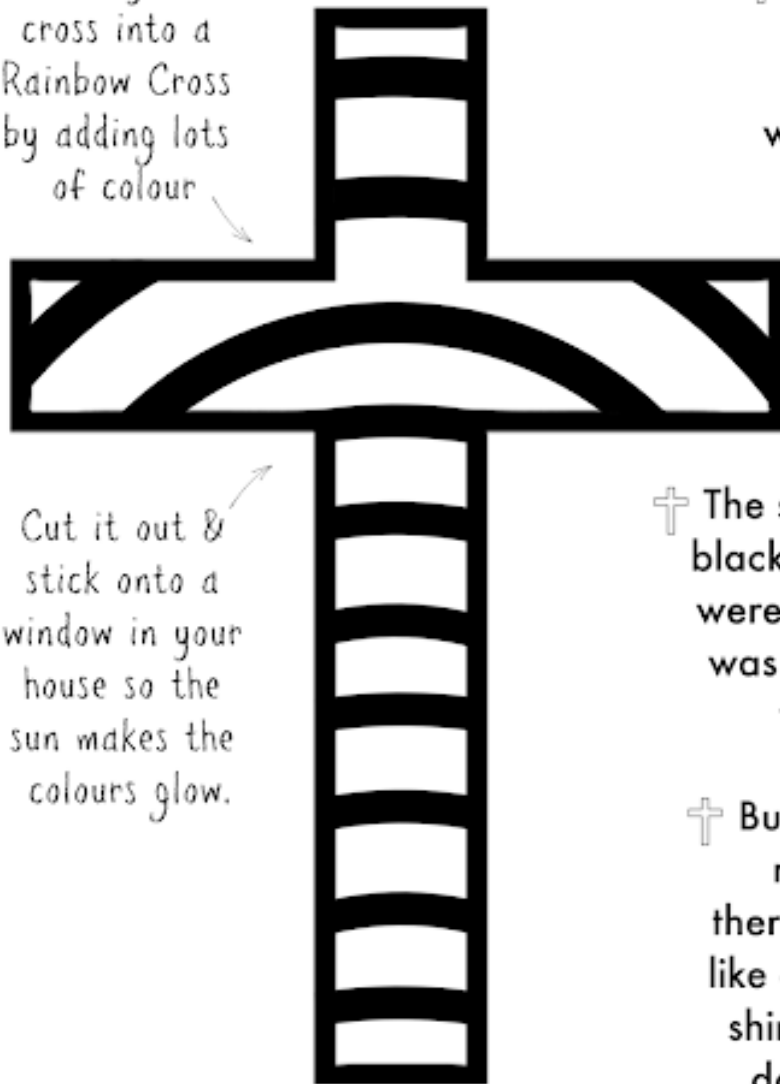
